## A Quick Refresher on Clubhouse Rules

Once again, with most of the club's activities moving inside, this is good opportunity for me to review some of the fundamental rules of the club.

4. No children playing on the putting green. A sensitive issue, but children don't understand the importance of maintaining the integrity of the green for putting. Perhaps you could have them play in the corner of the patio where there are no tables. You can still keep an eye on them that way.

5. Cell Phones are prohibited in the dining areas. Please excuse yourself to the hall while taking a call. Have you ever noticed that we all tend to speak louder on a cell phone?

6. No Children under 16yrs in Grill Bar after 6:00pm. It's the only place adults can gather and 'let their hair down.' Conversations may not always be 'G' rated.

7. Non-members must be accompanied by a Member whenever they are in attendance at the club. A non-member may not attend the club if the host member is unable to attend with them. (Please refer to Rule 29.1 on page B-11 in your roster booklets for a more concise explanation of 'Frequency of Guest Introduction'. Therein it states that guest privileges in all areas, other than dining rooms and Multi-day Events, are limited to once during each calendar month.)

When you've been a member for any length of time there's the tendency for these rules to get fuzzy.

For new members, this presents an opportunity to help you recognize some of more common miscues the club encounters. For everyone it offers a clarification.

## Two Quick Reminders

**One:** Reservations are very helpful for us in both anticipating your attendance, and properly staffing. Please take the time to call ahead.

**Two:** We still need email addresses. You can call them in, email them in, snail mail them in, but the more we have, the more effective we can be in our communications. The paperless Birchbark is not far off, and we don't want you to lose the opportunity to keep informed.

## Divot Diggings

Just when you think summer finally arrives you look at the calendar and it's already late August. Where did it all go? July had very mild temperatures and for most of the month it felt more like fall than mid summer. August has begun to increase our disease pressure with significant increases in humidity. Combine that with the longer nights and you have a perfect environment for Dollar Spot, Brown Patch and Anthracnose.

We have had some questions regarding the dark green circles that you see on a couple of greens. This is called Fairy Ring. It is caused by soil-inhabiting fungi called Basidiomycetes. They live in the dead organic matter in soil or thatch. There is only one permanent cure for this and it is the removal of the soil. This is not practical so we mask the rings with fertilizer. When the fertilizer becomes low you can see the rings more clearly.

We continue to work on improving the drainage on the course and its working very well. We had over three inches of rain the weekend of August 8th and 9th and we only lost one day to carts. There are still a few areas that we would like to work on and continue to improve everyday playing conditions.

This fall we will be aerating starting on September the 8th. Greens will be plugged on September 8th and the holes filled September 8th and 9th weather permitting. The greens will heal in two weeks and will be playable within a week.

Tees will be plugged on September 9th and 10th. Fairways will be done over a two week period from September 8th thru September 22nd. If the weather is good we can finish fairways much earlier but if we get excessive rain it really slows the fairway process down.

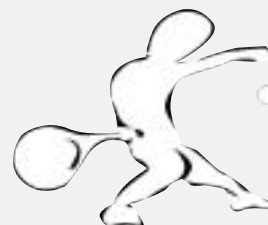
